Tenth Annual Art of Found Objects Student & Teacher Art Auction
Proceeds Benefit Art Programs in Miami-Dade County Public Schools

Miami, FL, September 26, 2007 — Miami-Dade County Public Schools students and art teachers put their creative caps on when working on artwork for the Annual Ocean Bank Center/Education Fund **Art of Found Objects Art Auction**. The process begins with recycled materials provided by the Ocean Bank Center for Educational Materials (OBCEM). This year's artwork includes the use of styrofoam, telephone wire, ceramic tiles, historical calendars of South Florida, sequined paper, plastic perfume bottles and much more. All materials provided by the OBCEM are available for free to teachers to use in the classroom. Equipped with these "found objects," students and teachers use their creativity to convert them into impressive works of art such as paintings, drawings, traditional sculptures, mixed-media and 3D pieces.

Miami-Dade students and art teachers have created more than 150 works of art which will be sold at the **Annual Art of Found Objects Silent Art Auction** taking place at the **Doral Golf Resort and Spa** (4400 NW 87 Avenue, Miami) on **Friday, October 19, 2007; 7:00-9:30 p.m.** In its tenth year, the art auction is sponsored by Ocean Bank, The Education Fund, and The Doral Golf Resort and Spa. Proceeds raised from the auction benefit art programs in Miami-Dade County public schools.

"This event allows the community to support art education in our public schools," said Linda Lecht, president of The Education Fund. "The artwork is creative and beautiful, proving the amazing work students can create when they have the means and support." This year, striking pieces for the Art Auction were submitted by students from 23 Miami-Dade County Public Schools, a number of them in some of the county's low-income neighborhoods. Participating schools included Banyan Elementary, Rainbow Park Elementary, Biscayne Elementary, Centennial Middle, Dr. Michael Krop High and Miami Springs High among many others.

"Ocean Bank has been involved with this art program for more than a decade," said José Concepción, president and CEO of Ocean Bank. "This year we celebrate 25 years of banking in South Florida and some of the artwork celebrates our anniversary. As a community bank, we are committed to encouraging student creativity and supporting the arts in education."
